

**FISCAL YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2023 — FORM 990-N (e-POSTCARD)**

No full Form 990 or 990-EZ is in the IRS public e-file set for this year.

## Why there is no multi-page 990 PDF

Organizations whose annual gross receipts are normally \$50,000 or less may satisfy the IRC §6033 annual filing requirement by submitting Form 990-N, an electronic postcard. The IRS does not publish a traditional Form 990 PDF for 990-N years. The postcard reports only:

1. Legal name and any DBA
2. EIN
3. Mailing address
4. Website (if any)
5. Confirmation that annual gross receipts are normally \$50,000 or less
6. Name and address of a principal officer
7. Whether the organization has terminated

## What public indexes show for this year

A third-party EIN index records a Form 990-N filing for the tax year ending December 31, 2023, described as a declaration of gross receipts under \$25,000. No 990 or 990-EZ for 2023 appears on ProPublica. Beginning-of-year assets on the 2024 Form 990 were only \$3,170, which is consistent with a very small 2023 year.

## How to view the 990-N itself

Open IRS Tax Exempt Organization Search (<https://apps.irs.gov/app/eos/>), choose the Form 990-N database, and search EIN **81-3529184**. You can print the IRS listing; the agency does not issue a downloadable multi-page return for postcard years.

ProPublica's organization page for DMT Quest lists extracted 990 / 990-EZ years 2020, 2021, and 2024 only, which is consistent with 2022 and 2023 having been 990-N years.
